## 2020 Service Highlights

177 crisis calls from women seeking support, shelter, and resources

43 women entered our shelter seeking safety and services.

12 women completed our Employment Readiness program.

2 women worked with law enforcement with our support to report crimes against them.

5 women attended drug treatment.

34 residents participated in horse/dog therapeutic programming.

33 residents developed a Safety Plan & Case Plan.

34 residents engaged in learning various household Independent Living Skills.

18 residents received legal advocacy support services.

13 residents received aftercare services upon exiting the shelter program.

40 residents received an assessment from our Registered Nurse and had access to medical care and mental health services.

40 residents received education on health concerns & options, medication regiments.

33 residents had opportunities to grow in their faith and spiritual lives.

Note: Due to initial COVID-19 shutdown we were not able to bring in new clients for approximately 6 weeks.

I would like to share with you another exciting development that is currently in progress—the development of a Survivor Advisory Board. This board will be facilitated by past residents of Terebinth Refuge and will include current residents who apply for this important position. The purpose of this board is to advise staff, and the Terebinth Refuge board members on best trauma informed practices and ways Terebinth Refuge can improve in our services. This board will also be responsible to develop a viable aftercare program for women we have served. We believe that survivor's knowledge & voices are vital in the work we do to provide the best care possible to the residents of Terebinth Refuge. I am beyond grateful to God for His goodness to us! I am also beyond grateful to all of you who have supported Terebinth Refuge in SO many ways to allow this growth to happen. Thank you, dear ones, for persevering with us, to be a catalyst of lifesaving change in the women we serve!

## Hope & Healing Store Opens for Business

Handcrafted Skincare Products Support Women in Their Recovery



You can treat your skin well and support women escaping sexual exploitation and trafficking with the purchase of handcrafted products from Terebinth Refuge's new social enterprise. The Hope & Healing Store provides a way for survivors to expand their work skills as they prepare to transition into community living. The store is survivor-led, and women can feel safe and understood while growing professionally. Throughout the process, survivors are producing, packaging, selling, and distributing the various items.

Some of the many handcrafted items include:

- Natural goat milk soap crafted with pure essential oils, goat milk, botanicals, and a natural lard base.
- Angel ice, a salve combining aloe vera gel with anti-inflammatory botanicals to relieve sunburn, rash, skin irritations, hot flashes, hives, bug bites, and minor cuts and bites.
- Natural cream deodorant that controls under arm odors while allowing your skin to breathe and detoxify.



The business gives women an opportunity to develop employment habits and skills, learn about running a business, build their resume, and earn money for their personal needs, all while remaining safely within our transition home. When they are ready to seek outside employment, they will have the experience and skills to help them succeed in the community.

"Working in the Hope and Healing store, talking about God, and praying before every batch of soap we make, opened me up to talk about the spiritual experiences I've encountered in my life," said Key, a Terebinth Refuge graduate and supervisor at the store.

As the women have been in production since mid-September, many survivors can already testify to the self-growth benefits the store provides. The business gives survivors an opportunity to feel productive and proud of themselves.
